


# Thanos' Theory



While food production increases at a linear rate, population rises exponentially.


Therefore, as a civilization expands, overpopulation and resource scarcity are inevitable. So, how do we do to solve this problem?




Believing that the world is suffering. Thanos believes that the only way to free up resources in the overpopulated cosmos is to randomly disintegrate half of all life.


