




จุดประสงค์การเรียนรู้

Brian: You and millions of other (5) viewers in the country! My sister is having a last (6) episode party with her friends and even my dad's staying home to watch Angelica. Oh, come on, let's go to Tony's. They have a TV set in the restaurant.

Brian: What can I do to

Present Continuous (Future Arrangements)

is often used to talk about future, especially about future plans when we <u>have decided</u> a time and a place with other people.

Brian: What are you doing tonight?

Amy: I'm staying home. (arrangements)

Brian: You're going to stay home

on a Saturday night? (intentions)

Amy: Sorry. Nothing you say will change my mind. But would you like to (10) come over and watch with us?

What are you doing tonight? Future Time Expressions

tomorrow
next week
this weekend
in a month

Present Continuous (Future Arrangements)

We prefer using <u>present continuous</u> when we have made <u>arrangements</u>. (a place and time)

We use <u>be going to</u>, we put the emphasis on our <u>intention</u> to do something.

(arrangements)

Brian: What are you doing tonight?

Amy: I'm staying home. (arrangements)

Brian: You're going to stay home on a Saturday night? (intentions)

Present Continuous (Future Arrangements) Present Continuous

(arrangements)

Q: What are you doing tonight?

(be verb + subject + v.ing)

A: I'm staying home.

(subject + be verb + v.ing)

be going to (intentions)

Brian: You're going to stay home on a Saturday night?

(subject + be verb + going + to + infinitive verb)

(essentially the base form of a verb with the word "to" in front of it)

1. I <u>am studying</u> Japanese at the university next year. (study)

(arrangements)

2. That man is very angry with the waiter. He <u>is going to leave</u> without paying. (leave) (attention)

3. John and Mary <u>are going to have</u> dinner in an expensive restaurant this evening. (have) (attention)


4. What are you doing for your holidays this summer? (you do)

(arrangements)

(arrangements)
5. I <u>am getting</u> that job today!
I don't want to be unemployed any longer! (get)

6. If you are rude to everybody, nobody <u>is going to have</u> you. (like) (attention)

7. Aunt Mary <u>is coming</u> to see us next week. I'm looking forward to it. (come) (arrangements)
