Future Simple and Future Continuous

Similarities:

Time Reference: Both tenses refer to actions or events that will happen in the future.

Formation: Both tenses use the auxiliary verb "will" for their formation.

Prediction: Both can be used to make predictions about the future.

Politeness and Certainty: Both tenses can convey politeness or a degree of certainty when discussing future plans or events.

Differences:

Points	Future Simple	Future Continuous
Structure	Will + infinitive verb (e.g., "I will go")	Will be + present participle (e.g., "I will be going")
Nature of Action	Describes a single, completed action that will happen in the future.	Describes an ongoing action that will be happening at a specific point in the future.
Focus	Focuses on the fact that an action will occur.	Focuses on the process or duration of an action at a particular moment in the future.
Use Cases	Often used for promises, decisions made at the moment of speaking, predictions, offers, and scheduled events.	Often used to describe actions that will be in progress, to project into the future, or to set the scene for another future action.

Points	Future Simple	Future Continuous
Time Expressions	Commonly used with time expressions like "tomorrow," "next week," or "in a year."	Commonly used with time expressions that specify a particular moment or duration, such as "at this time tomorrow," "at 5 PM," or "all day."
Context	Can be used for a general statement about the future.	Often implies a specific context or scenario where the action will be ongoing.
