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Adverbs of Frequency

Adverbs of frequency describe how often something happens. The structure of adverbs of frequency is fairly simple, and they are typically placed in specific positions within a sentence.

The general structure:

1. **Subject + Adverb of Frequency + Main Verb**

Example: "She **always** drinks coffee in the morning."

2. **Subject + Be (am, is, are) + Adverb of Frequency + Complement**

Example: "They **are never** late for meetings."

Common Adverbs of Frequency:

- **Always** (100%)
- **Usually** (80-90%)
- **Frequently** (70-80%)
- **Often** (50-70%)
- **Sometimes** (30-50%)
- **Occasionally** (20-30%)
- **Rarely** (10-20%)
- **Never** (0%)

Tips for Placement:

- **Always, usually, and often** are commonly placed before the main verb, except when the main verb is "be," in which case the adverb goes after it.

Example: "I **always** eat salad for dinner."

Example: "She **is always** happy after she drinks some black coffee."

- **Never** is placed directly before the main verb or after the verb "be."

Example: "He **never** eats fast food."

Example: "Jimmy **never** tries sushi."

Example: "They **are never** bored if they are at home all day."
