

Vocabulary



firework (n)

Bright, colorful lights that explode in the sky :



Examples

- ❖ We watched the fireworks light up the night sky on New Year's Eve.
- ❖ Taking photos of fireworks is difficult because they move so fast.

celebrate (v)

To do something special for an event or holiday:



Examples

- ❖ My family always celebrates birthdays with a big dinner.
- ❖ The town celebrates its founding day every April with a parade.

resolution (n)

A promise or goal you make for the new year:

**I will study
harder.**



Examples

- ❖ My New Year's resolution is to study English every day.
- ❖ She made a resolution to exercise more often.

countdown (n)

An act of counting backwards to zero:



Examples

- ❖ The **countdown** to the New Year started at ten.
- ❖ The crowd shouted together during the **countdown**.

firecrackers (n)

Small explosives that make loud bangs during festivals.



Examples

- ❖ People lit **firecrackers** to celebrate the New Year.
- ❖ The teacher told the students not to play with **firecrackers**.

lantern (n)

A festival light or lamp, often used in celebrations:



Examples

- ❖ The glowing lanterns looked beautiful at night.
- ❖ Many tourists came to see the lantern festival in Chiang Mai.

envelope (n)

A paper container used to hold letters or money:



Examples

- ❖ He gave me a red **envelope** for New Year.
- ❖ The teacher handed out **envelopes** to all students.

put up (v)

To hang or place decorations:



Examples

- ❖ We put up a New Year poster in our classroom.
- ❖ They put up colorful lights around the school.
