Vocabulary



generation (n)

All the people of about the same age within a society or within a particular family:



Examples

- ❖ My grandparents' **generation** did not use smartphones.
- ❖ Teenagers today are part of a very creative **generation**.

impact (n)

The strong effect or influence that something has on a situation or person:

Examples

- ❖ Pollution has a big **impact** on the environment.
- ❖ Social media has a strong **impact** on teenagers' lives.



necessary (adj)

Needed in order to achieve a particular result:

Examples

- ❖ It is **necessary** to drink water every day.
- ❖ Wearing a helmet is **necessary** when riding a motorcycle.



climate change (n)

Changes in the world's weather, in particular the fact that it is believed to be getting warmer as a result of human activity increasing the level of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere:

Examples

- ❖ Many animals are losing their homes because of **climate change**.
- ❖ **Climate change** affects the weather, making storms stronger.

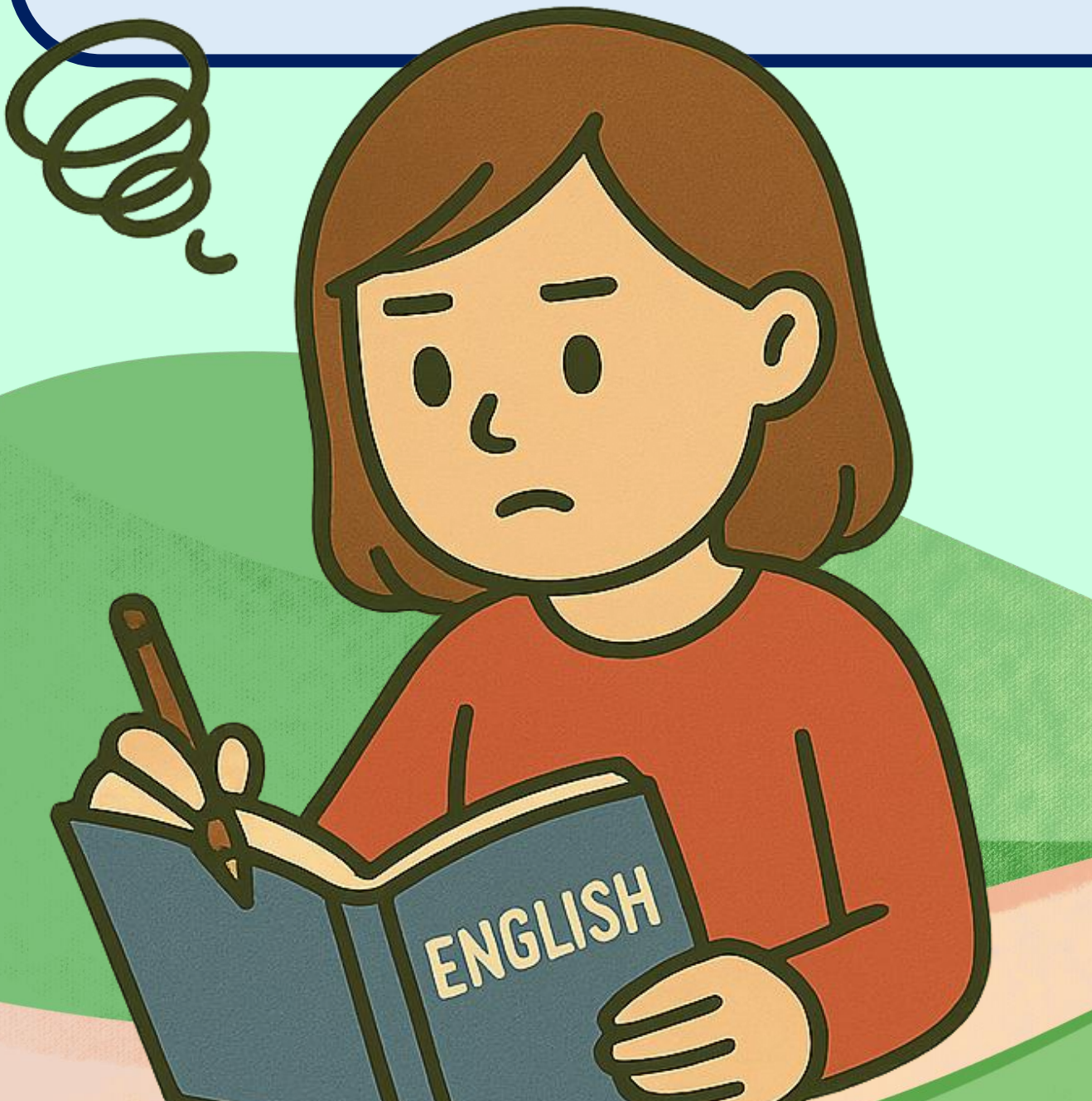


require (v)

To need something or make something necessary:

Examples

- ❖ This job **requires** good communication skills.
- ❖ Learning English **requires** patience and effort.

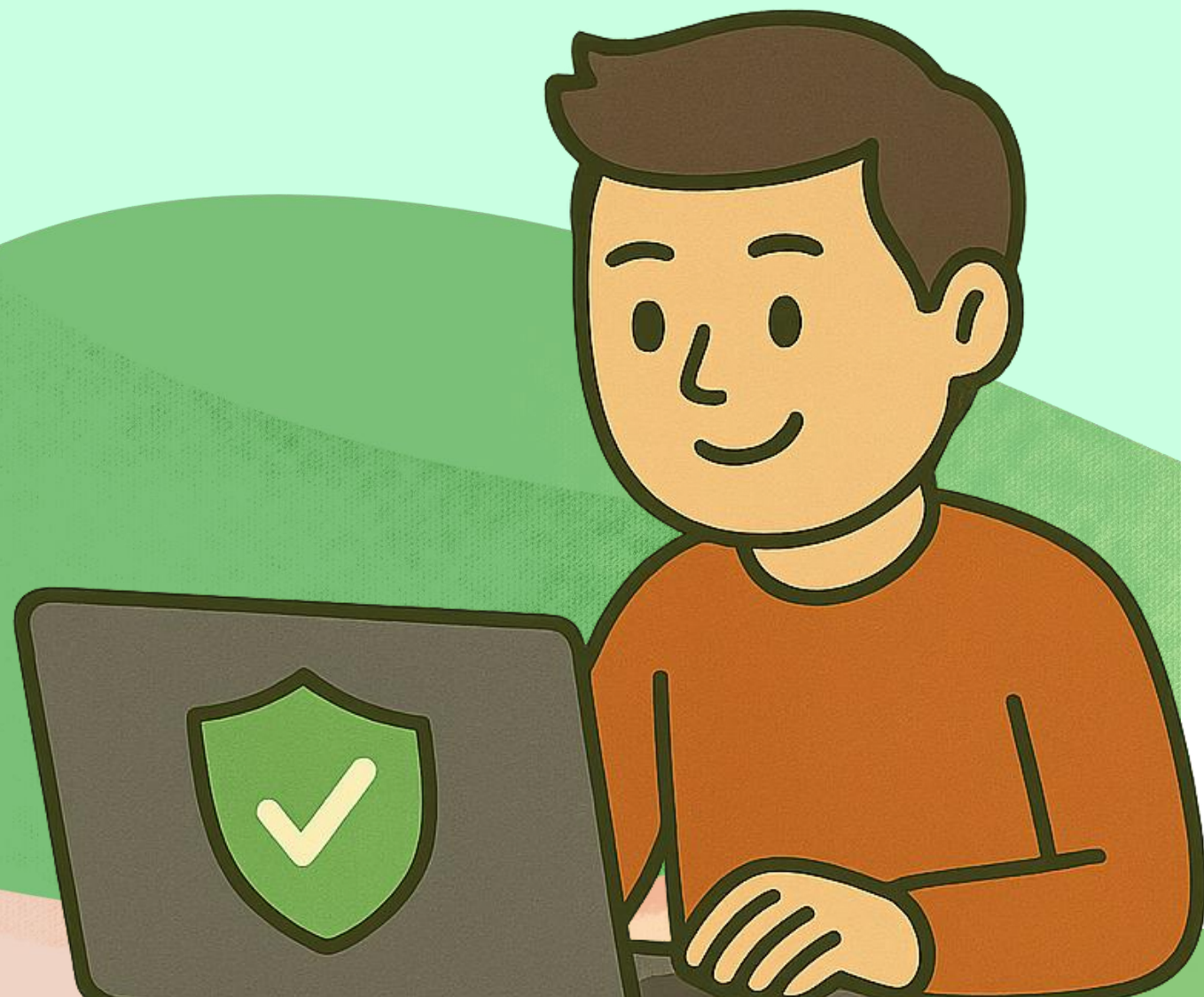


secure (adj)

Positioned or fixed firmly and correctly and therefore not likely to move, fall, or break:

Examples

- ❖ The door is **secure**, so no one can enter without a key.
- ❖ The website is **secure**, so your information is safe.



invest (v)

To put money into a project, or to buy property, shares in a company, etc., hoping to make a profit or get an advantage:

Examples

- ❖ Many people **invest** money in the stock market.
- ❖ The government will **invest** in clean energy projects.



Reported Speech

(Present Simple to Past Simple)





Reported Speech:

Present Simple to Past Simple

When we change direct speech to reported speech, **the Present Simple (S+V1) changes to Past Simple (S+V2).**





Reported Speech:

Present Simple to Past Simple

Direct Speech

Direct speech is when we **repeat the exact words** that someone says. We use **quotation marks** (“...”).

Reported Speech

Reported speech (also called indirect speech) is when we **tell someone what another person said** without using their exact words.
