# escape (v)

To get free from something such as a prison or cage, or from someone who will not allow you to leave:



## Examples

- ❖ We climbed to the roof to **escape** the rising floodwater.
- ❖ The prisoner planned to **escape**, but the guards stopped him.

# quicksand (n)

A mass of wet sand into which people and objects can sink:



## Examples

- ❖ **Quicksand** can trap you if you move too quickly.
- ❖ The boy stepped into the **quicksand** by accident.

# enemy (n)

A person who hates or opposes another person and tries to harm them or stop them from doing something:




## Examples

- ❖ Fear can be your biggest **enemy**.
- ❖ The soldiers prepared to face their **enemies**.

# movement (n)

A change of position:



## Examples

- ❖ The **movement** of the waves made the boat shake.
- ❖ His slow **movement** showed that he was very tired.

# surface (n)

The outer or top part or layer of something:



## Examples

- ❖ The water's **surface** was calm and shiny.
- ❖ Dust covered the **surface** of the table.

# suction (n)

The process of reducing air pressure by removing air or liquid from an enclosed space, or the force created by this reduction that causes two surfaces to stick together:



## Examples

- ❖ Quicksand creates strong **suction** if you move too fast.
- ❖ Strong **suction** can pull objects underwater.

# release (v)

To give freedom or free movement to someone or something:



## Examples

- ❖ The teacher told the students to **release** the balloons.
- ❖ He opened his hand to **release** the small fish back into the water.

# backwards (adv)

Towards the direction that is opposite to the one in which you are facing or opposite to the usual direction:



## Examples

- ❖ He stepped **backwards** when he saw the snake.
- ❖ The car rolled **backwards** down the hill.

# panic (v)

To suddenly feel so worried or frightened that you cannot think or behave calmly or reasonably:



## Examples

- ❖ He didn't **panic** because he knew what to do in an emergency.
- ❖ The swimmers **panicked** when the waves became stronger.

# How to Escape Quicksand?



**1: KNOW YOUR ENEMY.** Quicksand is a mix of sand or other loose soil filled with water. It's less deadly than movies suggest, and you won't go under as long as you stay calm.



**3: LOSE THE EXTRAS.** If you have a heavy bag, take it off. The extra weight will make it harder for you to move and get out of the quicksand safely.



**5: LEAN BACKWARDS.** Lean your body back and spread your arms wide. This gives you more surface area, which helps your body float on the quicksand instead of sinking.



**2: MOVE SLOWLY.** If you struggle or panic, the sand will trap more air and pull you down. But if you move slowly and gently, you can stay on top of the sand without creating strong suction.



**4: GET YOUR LEGS FREE.** If your feet get stuck, lift them up slowly, one at a time. Moving gently helps release the suction and makes it easier to get free.



**6: GET OUT.** When you feel the suction is gone, move your arms and legs gently across the surface. Slide your body toward solid ground instead of pushing straight down.
