Vocabulary



unbuckle (v)

To release the buckle (= metal fastener) of a shoe, belt, etc. so that you can remove it:



Examples

- ❖ He **unbuckled** his seatbelt and got out of the car.
- ❖ Please do not **unbuckle** your seat belt during take off.

passenger (n)

A person who is travelling in a vehicle but is not driving it, flying it, or working on it:



Examples

- ❖ Each **passenger** must wear a seatbelt during the flight.
- ❖ The bus was full of **passengers** going to the city.

seatbelt (n)

A belt that fastens around you when you are travelling in a vehicle or aircraft and holds you in your seat, in order to reduce the risk of being injured in an accident:


Examples

- ❖ Always wear your **seatbelt** to stay safe in the car.
- ❖ The teacher checked if every student had fastened their **seatbelt**.



scenario (n)

A description of possible actions or events in the future:



Examples

- ❖ In this **scenario**, you must stay calm and move slowly.
- ❖ The teacher gave the class three different **scenarios** to practice.

immediately (adv)

Now or without waiting or thinking:



Examples

- ❖ You must leave the building **immediately** when you hear the alarm.
- ❖ She called the police **immediately** after the accident.

sinking (adj)

Falling or moving to a lower level:

Examples

- ❖ The man escaped from a **sinking** car by breaking the window.
- ❖ A **sinking** boat can be very dangerous if people panic.



plenty (n)

(The state of having) enough or more than enough, or a large amount:



Examples

- ❖ There is **plenty** of water in the bottle, so don't worry.
- ❖ We still have **plenty** of time to finish the lesson.

stay calm (phr.v.)

To continue to be quiet, peaceful, and not worried, especially in a difficult or frightening situation:



Examples

- ❖ **Stay calm** when you get stuck in quicksand.
- ❖ Please **stay calm** while we solve the problem.

mental (adj)

Of or about the mind, or involving the process of thinking:

Examples



- ❖ Staying **mental** calmness helps you survive dangerous situations.
- ❖ Good **mental** health is important for students.

vehicle (n)

A machine, usually with wheels and an engine, used for transporting people or goods, especially on land:



Examples

- ❖ A **vehicle** can float for a short time before sinking.
- ❖ The police stopped the **vehicle** for a safety check.



How to Escape a Sinking Car?



1. Stay calm and think clearly

A vehicle usually remains afloat for 30 seconds to two minutes. This short period gives you **plenty** of time to escape if you stay **calm** and act quickly. Keeping strong **mental** focus will help you make smart decisions.



3. Follow this order: "Seatbelts – Kids – Windows – Exit."

First, **unbuckle** your **seatbelt**. If it is stuck, cut it. Then assist children or any other **passenger** who needs help. Get ready to escape through a window—not the door.



5. Use the window as your escape route

Try lowering the window **immediately**. If it does not open, use a window-breaking tool to smash it. Car windows are designed to be very strong, so breaking them with your hands or feet is nearly impossible.



2. Do not try to open the door

Opening a car door in water is extremely difficult because of the strong water pressure. This **scenario** can make the car **sinking** faster, trapping every **passenger** inside.



4. Help children and other passengers

Make sure they **unbuckle** their **seatbelts**. If possible, guide them to exit through their own window. If not, lead them to the nearest window at the front.



6. Swim out and move toward a safe area

Once outside the window, push away from the vehicle and swim toward safety. Staying **calm** and knowing these steps can help you escape in less than a minute.
