# Asking for permission การขออนุญาต

We use “**can**” in these ways:

- to ask for something
- to ask to do something
- to ask other people to do things for us

Can I open the window here?

Of course.





Can you help me?

Certainly!

To be polite in English,  
you can add “**please**”  
at the end of a question  
when asking someone to do  
something for you.



Can I borrow your cell phone, please?

Sure.

Can I use this computer?

Could I use your umbrella?

Can I use your telephone for a minute?

Could I borrow some money from you, please?

## Can / Could / May + I, we + inf. + please?

- **Can** I borrow your pencil, please?
- **Could** I borrow your pencil, please?
- **May** I borrow your pencil, please?

# Response: Agree to permission

All right

Of course

# Response: Decline permission

การปฏิเสธการขออนุญาต

I'm sorry. I haven't got any.

Sorry, I'm using it at the moment.

I'm sorry. But I have to use it today.

# Response: Decline permission

I'm sorry,

I wish I could,

I'd like to,

I'm afraid I can't.

} but I'm very busy.

## Asking for request การขอร้อง

A request is asking for help from someone.

Can / Could / + you + inf. + please?

กรุณา ..... หน่อยได้ไหมครับ/คะ

Could you do me a favor, please?

Could you give me a hand, please?

กรุณาช่วยผมหน่อยได้ไหมครับ

Can you turn on the radio, please?

Could you tell me the time, please?

Could you clean up the room for me, please?

Sure.

Certainly.

Oh, all right.

Yes, of course.
